Current Volume Report

- There was a 22% increase in volume for March 2019 compared to March 2018.
- There was a 6% decrease in volume through March 2019 compared to the same period in 2018.
- Total program costs through March 2019 are \$1505.52 higher than the same period in 2018.

Grants

- **DEQ 2019 SCRAP TIRE COLLECTION GRANT PROGRAM**
 - First scrap tire event will be held on Saturday, June 29 from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. or until trailers are full.
 - Upcoming promotion includes regular press releases leading up to the event and information in the monthly recycling e-newsletter.
 - Volunteers are needed to assist with check-in/residency verification and traffic control. Contact Sarah to sign up.
- **RURAL ELECTRONICS RECYCLING GRANT**
 - The Networks Northwest Materials Management Advisory Committee held a special meeting to discuss applying for the EGLE Rural Electronics Recycling Grant to establish permanent electronics drop-off locations across the region. Permanent sites must be open to the public no less than 4 hours of one day each month.
 - In Manistee County, Bay Area Recycling for Charities would serve as a permanent site however a location to serve the heavier populated areas around the City of Manistee was also discussed.
 - Grant funding would be requested to cover the costs of setting up a drop-off location including a storage building, containers, signage, etc. The grant also covers processing costs for CRT/LED/LCD monitors and TVs.

- A 25% match is required. General administrative staff time (limited to 60%), indirect costs, and in-kind services can be used as matching funds.
- Application deadline is August 1, 2019.

Other

- Michigan Recycling Coalition Annual Conference – May 14-16, 2019 Ann Arbor Sheraton
 - Attended session for Counties: *Ready. Set. Plan.* – Thursday, May 16 10:30 am – Noon
 - Presentation by Christina Miller, DEQ provides comprehensive explanation of changes to Michigan Solid Waste law.
 - Session Description: Planning for disposal is a thing of the past. With a fully funded program and a renewed mission, wholesale changes to Michigan solid waste laws, Part 115, are next. County Planning requires local governments and private sector partners to work together to assure capacity is in place to manage materials at the end of their useful life but hasn't been deployed in 20 years. With the expectation of passage this year, gain a comprehensive understanding of the changes to Michigan solid waste law that will update and reinvigorate the County Planning process. With these anticipated changes, learn what tools and resources are being developed to support County Materials Management Planning and move Michigan beyond disposal.
 - Session Take-Aways:
 - Materials Utilization Goals (MUG) will be established through the Materials Management Planning (MMP) process.
 - The MMP process is expected to be completed in no more than 36 months.
 - MMP Grants cover the costs for preparing, implementing, and maintaining MMP.
 - MMP Grant is \$60,000 for each county plus \$0.50 per capita up to \$300,000 for up to 3 years to cover the higher upfront costs of initiating the new planning process.
 - Financial incentive for regional MMP - \$10,000 per county.
 - County annually meet MMP Grant requirements to receive funding, which will be automatic if progress towards MUG is shown.
 - County Board of Commissioners certify progress towards MUG every 2 years after EGLE approval of MMP. Certification makes County eligible for Growing Recycling Access and Voluntary Participation Program grant funding.
 - 67% approval from municipalities required to submit MMP.
 - MMP Committee made up of 11 members – only one from solid waste disposal facility
 - New - Board of Commissioners are responsible for all aspects of the MMP and its implementation.
 - New – Responsible for either siting any needed facilities or finding alternate materials management facilities outside of the planning area.
 - New – Planning Grant money will flow through the county.
 - New – MMP Committee approves the Designated Planning Agency (DPA) work program.
 - New – MMP Committee advises county and municipalities of the priorities.
- Part 115 Solid Waste Amendment Legislation Update
 - The Director of Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy (EGLE) has authorized bringing together the advisory group to review HB 6483 and move it forward in the process for reintroduction this legislative session.
 - Local action is needed to show support for the Proposed Amendments to Part 115 Michigan Solid Waste laws. Funding was approved in 2019 that would bring funding to Counties for Materials Management Planning if Proposed Amendments to Part 115 are passed. A resolution by the County, letters to the Governor, EGLE Director, and local legislators are recommended actions.
