RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2022 MANISTEE COUNTY APPORTIONMENT REPORT AS A RESULT OF ADDITIONAL MILLAGE BEING REQUESTED BY ARCADIA AND MARILLA TOWNSHIPS

At a regular meeting of the Manistee County Board of Commissioners held in the Manistee County Courthouse & Government Center, 415 Third Street, Manistee, Michigan, on the 15thth day of November, 2022.

WHEREAS, the County Board of Commissioners are required to meet each October to examine certificates and direct the spread of taxes in terms of millage rates to be spread on taxable value.

WHEREAS, on October 18, 2022, the Manistee County Board of Commissioners accepted and approved the 2022 Apportionment Report as prepared and presented by the Equalization Director, approved the millage rates within the report that were ordered levied on the taxable value of their respective taxing jurisdictions.

WHEREAS, at the General Election held on November 8, 2022, the voters of Arcadia Township approved the ballot proposal that permits Arcadia Township to levy up to 1.0000 mill for Arcadia Lake-Lake Michigan Channel Maintenance Improvement. Also, at the General Election held on November 8, 2022, the voters of Marilla Township approved the ballot proposal that permits Marilla Township to levy up to .6000 mills for the purpose of providing funds for Fire and EMS Protection.

WHEREAS, Arcadia Township has filed an amended Form L-4029 requesting that 1.0000 mill be levied on December 1, 2022. Also, Marilla Township has filed an amended Form L-4029 requesting that .6000 mills be levied on December 1, 2022.

WHEREAS, the County Board of Commissioners pursuant to Public Act 206 of 1893 Section 211.36 (5) shall meet and direct or amend its direction for the spread of millages by local units in the county.

WHEREAS, an Amended 2022 Apportionment Report has been prepared and presented by the Equalization Director.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Manistee County Board of Commissioners accept the Amended 2022 Apportionment Report as prepared and presented by the Equalization Director, approves the millage rates within the amended report that are ordered levied on the taxable value of their respective taxing jurisdictions as amended on November 15, 2022, as Manistee County’s official apportionment report.

SUPPORT FOR ECONOMIC IMPACT STUDY CONSUMERS ENERGY DAMS

WHEREAS, on August 09, 2022, Consumers Energy announced it will gather opinions from the public about the 13 dams they own and operate on five Michigan rivers to help guide their decisions about the future of those electric generating facilities; and

WHEREAS, two of the dams, Tippy Dam in Manistee county and Hodenpyl Dam in Wexford and Manistee County have significant impact on economic well-being of our county; and

WHEREAS, members of the public and local leaders have expressed great concern regarding the potential removal of these two hydro facilities/dams; and

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WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners believes that both Tippy and Hodenpyl dams are an integral part of the character of our region and should be preserved for the economic, recreational, and esthetic impact they bring; and

WHEREAS, to quantify the potential economic impact of the decommissioning of the 13 listed dams it is necessary that reliable and objective data is obtained relative to the operating costs and true economic impact of each of the dams to their local communities; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Manistee County Board of Commissioners requests that Consumers Energy has a responsibility to fund state-wide economic and environmental studies by an independent consultant with expertise in these subjects to obtain accurate picture of the true economic and environmental impacts to the State of Michigan and Manistee County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the assistance of the Michigan Association of Counties (MAC) is requested in this endeavor, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Manistee County Board of Commissioners further support the exploration of other funding sources for these studies including but not limited to State and Federal grants.
